Planting Seeds For The Future Through Donations Today

Back in April, 2014, South High Botany instructor Nicole Schumacher submitted a Spring Grant Proposal to manage a garden plot with her Botany students at the RCS/Nourish Nonprofit Charity Garden Plots located on the RCS site on the north side of Sheboygan. SPEF's Fall and Spring grant proposal program awards teachers, staff, and students with items not funded in the school district's budget.

Schumacher's "innovative and creative" proposal included her Botany students and making it a part of her curriculum. Under her supervision, the students got hands-on experience cultivating, planting, maintaining, and harvesting the vegetable when ready.

Interestingly, the finished garden products would then be used by the South High FACE (Family and Consumer Education) classes for various units in its fall classes.



"The experience our students will gain from working first-hand in the garden is immeasurable," Schumacher wrote. The FACE classes will also provide samples throughout the school year during lunch, such as a salsa bar Schumacher added.

"I observed students who were able to gain first-hand knowledge while working on the land plot, as well as learn to work with others as they achieve a common goal," Schumacher said. "In addition to gaining knowledge and experience regarding gardening, they had to be responsible for themselves and communicate and organize their means of transportation to and from school and the land plot".

"Had it not been for the SPEF grant program, we would not have been able to have the land plot to provide students the experience of working directly in a large garden," Schumacher stated. "With the help of farm managers, they learn the skills needed to successfully grow and harvest produce for use in the classroom."

SUPPORT STUDENTS/FAMILIES THROUGH SCHOLARSHIPS

Sheboygan Area School District graduating seniors are special! In 2015, SPEF distributed over \$78,000 in 24 different scholarship accounts, several with multiple awards.

Total "local scholarship awards" for last year's graduating Class of 2015 totaled over \$1.3 million. The Sheboygan Public Education Foundation administers over 32 scholarships for graduating seniors within the Sheboygan Area School District. Some of these scholarships have been set up for immediate distribution, while others are for future students.

Individuals, families, businesses, and donors recognize the importance to assist students in their post-secondary educational goals with financial assistance. Each scholarship is "special" and is administered per the wishes of the donor. The Foundation assists donors in establishing scholarship guidelines, coordinates the distribution and collection of applications, and manages the distribution of scholarship funds.

The Foundation met with local school officials in June, 2015 and decided to "open" the SPEF scholarship essay applications to seniors in Sept, 2015, some five months ahead of time, to give seniors ample opportunity to compose that perfect essay response.
